



## The 1<sup>st</sup> World OCR University Championships 2018 and 1<sup>st</sup> World OCR Youth Championships 2018

Tuesday, November 13, 2018 SM Arena, Pasay City, Philippines

### Rationale

The **World OCR University Championships (WOUC)** and the **World OCR Youth Championships (WOYC)** are two sanctioned events of World OCR, the *Fédération Internationale de Sports d'Obstacles (FISO)*, the international governing body and sole competent authority for obstacle sports and related disciplines worldwide. Both these events support the mission of World OCR to promote the sport of Obstacle Course Racing (OCR) and meet the requirements specified by the International Olympic Committee to be a recognized sport with medal events at the Olympic Games.

These events are organized by **World OCR Asia**, the continental confederation for Asia of World OCR, and **Pilipinas Obstacle Sports Federation (POSF)**, the national sports association on obstacle sports recognized by the Philippine Sports Commission and Philippine Olympic Committee. POSF is a member of World OCR and World OCR Asia.

WOUC is in the process of meeting the requirements to be an official event of the International University Sports Federation, *Fédération Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU)*. FISU aims “to promote sporting values and encourage top performances in international competitions in harmony with and complementary to the higher values of education.” Through World OCR, the WOYC is in the process of meeting the requirements to be an official event of the Youth Olympic Games (YOG).

WOYC and WOUC invite participation from younger individuals following the cliché in sports of “starting them young.” The earlier an individual is exposed to a particular sport or discipline, the greater the probability for them to achieve proficiency as well as appreciate the values and positive behaviors.

### Specific Objectives

The objectives of these events are to:

1. Promote the growth of OCR;
2. Build rapport and social interaction across multinational and multicultural communities;
3. Promote the value of sportsmanship; and
4. Develop and encourage the youth to engage in a healthier lifestyle and become active Obstacle Course Racers (OCRacers).

1. Largest Country Contingent (i.e., country with the most number of OCRacers; combined WOUC and WOYC; except the Philippines)

3. Largest University Contingent (i.e., country with the most Number of OCRacers entered in WOUC; male and female combined)
4. Largest Youth Group Contingent (i.e., country with the most Number of OCRacers entered in WOYC; male and female combined)
5. Top Men's WOUC Team (i.e., lowest aggregate time of top 3 men from each country)
6. Top Men's WOYC Team (i.e., lowest aggregate time of top 3 men from each country)
7. Top Women's WOUC Team (i.e., lowest aggregate time of top 3 women from each country)
8. Top Women's WOYC Team (i.e., lowest aggregate time of top 3 women from each country)
9. Top combined WOUC team (i.e., lowest aggregate time of top 3 men and top 3 women from each country)

Customized obstacle-inspired trophies will be given.

## General Rules

- a) The obstacles shall:
  - i. be of varying levels (i.e., easy, moderate and difficult);
  - ii. be the same set of obstacles for the two (2) events; and
  - iii. only be attempted once.
  
- b) All OCRacers shall:
  - i. conduct themselves in a sportsman like manner;
  - ii. adhere to the intent of the rules when the exact wording of the rule may be interpreted in various ways;
  - iii. not be permitted an advantage not intended by a rule, or to conduct him/herself in a dangerous way;
  - iv. obey instructions from race officials;
  - v. treat other OCRacers, officials, volunteers, media, sponsors and spectators with respect and courtesy;
  - vi. not use abusive, derogatory or inflammatory language;
  - vii. inform a Technical Official immediately after withdrawing from the race. In case the OCRacers fail to do this before the end of the event, it may result a suspension;
  - viii. compete without receiving assistance other than from event personnel and officials;
  - ix. refrain from ambush marketing;
  - x. not dispose litter or equipment around the course except at clearly identified places. All items must be kept with the OCRacer and disposed of appropriately at the end of the race; and
  - xi. not attempt to gain unfair advantage in any way.
  
- c) Every OCRacer must make an honest attempt to complete all obstacles and may attempt an obstacle only once.
- d) OCRacers finishing with the same time shall be ranked by the number of obstacles completed. In the event the time and number of obstacles is equal, there shall be a tie. A finish line-video shall be made available.
- e) Failure to comply with these Rules and Rules of the Technical Committee may result in an OCRacer being verbally warned, subject to an athletic penalty, disqualified, suspended, or expelled. The nature of the rule violation will determine the subsequent penalty.
- f) A suspension or an expulsion will occur for very serious violations of either these Rules, and Rules of the Technical Committee and Anti-Doping Rules of the OSF.
- g) The Technical Committee may assess penalties, even if the infringement is not listed, if the Technical Official deems an unfair advantage has been gained, if a

dangerous situation has been created intentionally or for any unanticipated infringement that effects the outcome or safety of the race.

- h) All rules and policies of World OCR and the 2018 World OCR Competition Rules as they may be relevant, shall be applicable.
